

THERE'S NOTHING ORDINARY ABOUT THESE DOGS

DID YOU KNOW?

A working dog is a dog that has been trained to assist the owner who has a disability, whether it is physical, visual or developmental. Working dogs are legally allowed in ALL public places (except ICU).



GUIDE DOGS

For the visually impaired, identified wearing a leather harness with a metal handle.



SERVICE DOGS

For people with physical disabilities, identified wearing a red jacket with reflective strips and SA Guide-Dogs logo.



AUTISM SUPPORT DOGS

For children with Autism Spectrum Disorder, identified wearing a red jacket with a double harness and SA Guide-Dogs logo.



PUPPIES-IN-TRAINING

Work with Puppy Raisers to learn socialisation skills, identified wearing a blue collar and jacket with the SA Guide-Dogs logo.

RIGHTS OF WORKING DOG OWNERS

There are both local and international legislations that protect the rights of working dogs and their owners. Should you refuse access and/or service to a person with a disability with their working dog, appropriate action in the Equality Court or other appropriate forums may be brought against you and/or your company.
